- That vision guides your plans on how to organize your committee








Every Council is Different







Must have a NESA Committee to Confer

NESA Outstanding Eagle Scout Award (NOESA)

Recognition granted by the local council's NESA committee to Eagle Scouts who have demonstrated outstanding achievement at the local, state, or regional level



Glenn A. and Melinda W. Adams national Eagle Scout Service Project of the Year award (ESSPY)

Recognizes valuable service of an exceptional nature by an Eagle Scout candidate to a religious institution, a school, community or other entity through completion of an Eagle Scout project





5 Steps to Getting Started:

- 1. Be knowledgeable and understand the Alumni or NESA program
- 2. Obtain permission talk with the Scout Executive and the Council President about forming the committee(s)
- 3. Get help find others who can assist you
- 4. Create a plan for the next year reconnection, communication and service
- 5. Meet with Council Key-3 to discuss how the Alumni/NESA committee fits in the Strategic Plan
- 6. Start by doing something visible and build from there






