Background About NESA Scholarships

- Annual process, available from senior year of high school to junior year of college
- Open for submissions December 1-January 31
- Must be a NESA member to apply
- In 2024, NESA received 4,300+ applications and awarded 69 scholarships ranging from \$3,500 to \$48,000, totaling \$516,000
- Approximately 3,437 scholarships worth \$13,098,500 awarded since 1984

Writing a Scholarship Essay

- Research the organization awarding the scholarship
- Answer the essay prompt being asked
- Structure your essay using STAR
 - S: Situation
 - T: Tasks
 - A: Actions
 - R: Results



Past Essay Examples

- Essay for character
- Essay for community service
