 - Colors options are endless
 - Loops or button holes
 - Materials
- Patch companies have resources to guide you




We Need a New Patch...

- Group reviews the options and selects the winner
- Final approvals differ by lodge. They can include:
 - Youth members
 - LEC
 - Committees
 - Adviser
 - Staff Adviser
 - Supreme Chief of the Fire

Branding Guidelines

- A set of design rules that **must** be followed
- Some examples include:
 - What must be on the flap (WWW, fleur-de-lis, etc.)
 - Dimensions
 - Restrictions on trademark words, symbols, mottos, etc.

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

3. Patch Creation Process



From Order to Receipt

•Approved designs are sent to the National Supply Group or a patch design company (must have a BSA license)

- <u>www.licensingbsa.org</u>
 - Complete list of approved companies and what they're licensed to produce

•Sketches are digitized and prototypes are sent back for lodge acceptance

•Physical "sew-outs" are available (rare now with digital artwork)

•Average turnaround is 8 weeks except during peak demand (NOAC, Jamboree), plus customs
