- Finding what settings work USE THE ADRENALINE! best for YOU!




Embracing and Adjusting to Stress

The golden rules to a successful public speaker



Projection 101


Step 1: Stand up nice and tall if able

Step 2: Open your mouth wide when speaking naturally

Step 3: Diaphramic Breathing:


Deep breaths into the stomach


Step 4: Change intonation while speaking to keep the tone rolling



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
