





5. Safety Policies & Guidelines



 - Outdoor Ethics Advocate Training




Nature Deficit Disorder

Human beings – especially children – are spending less time outdoors – and this may cause behavioral problems with weakened ecological literacy & stewardship of the natural world





 - Conduct self-evaluation





Requirements:


- Earn the Outdoor Ethics Awareness Award

- Follow Outdoor Code, LNT & Tread Lightly principles on 3 outings
- Help troop service activity addressing recreational impacts
- Provide a report at a court of honor or similar event

Requirements:


- Earn the Outdoor Ethics Awareness Award
- Complete the BSA Outdoor Ethics Orientation Course
- Discuss with your troop the four points of the Outdoor Code
- Read the North American Skills & ethics booklet to learn about LNT
- Review the principles of Tread Lightly
- Review Chapter 7 of the *Scouts BSA & Fieldbook* chapters about LNT
- Facilitate troop's leadership in planning & leading an outing focused on LNT or Tread Lightly principles
- Help plan & participate in at least three outings following LNT & Tread Lightly principles
- Follow Outdoor Code, LNT & Tread Lightly principles on 3 outings
- Assist unit in a service project with a local landowner/manager emphasizing outdoor ethics
- Make a presentation at Roundtable about the three or more outings
- Help at least three Scouts earn their Outdoor Ethics Action Award

- May also be an Eagle Project
- A project may be on BSA property
- Council project proposal approval
- Council Board of Review

- **Scouts BSA**

- Two Projects
- Merit Badges – mandatory & elective

- **Venturer & Sea Scout**

- Two Projects
- Work with Cub Scout or Scouts BSA groups
- Research & outreach





Distinguished Conservation Service Award (3)

Categories include:

- Air and Water Pollution Control
- Energy Conservation
- Fish & Wildlife Management
- Forestry & Range Management
- Hazardous Materials Disposal and Management
- Invasive Species Control
- Pollinator Management
- Resource Recovery
- Soil & Water Conservation
- **Conservation Adviser**
- **Award Adviser**
- **Workbook** – similar to Eagle Project Workbook – but:
 - Preamble – the why??
 - Body – education & outreach
 - Postscript – what happened?





Distinguished Conservation Service Award (4)

Workbook

- Organization similar to Eagle Project Workbook
- Conservation Adviser and Award Adviser with thru project planning, execution and reporting.


Keep America Beautiful - Hometown USA
