Session Description

Learn how to survive a Zombie Apocalypse beyond just evasion and fighting. This session will focus on preparing before the apocalypse begins both mentally and physically and what to do once it begins.

Learning Outcomes

How your body will react naturally to seeing a zombie for the first time, what to do during and after that initial encounter. Once in a safe place, how to best set yourself up by gathering provisions and allies.

Theme Connection: Seek New Heights

Activity

Materials Needed: sticky notes, spray bottles

Length of Activity: # 10 minutes

Activity Description:

Have the 10 youngest and 3 largest volunteers come up

3 have spray bottles with water, 10 all of their own pad of sticky notes Sticky notes are the zombie virus and must be placed on a human

Make sure all volunteers are fine with being sprayed with water and sticky notes

being placed on them by other people before starting.

Explain to volunteers and crowd that there will be 5 rounds and each team won't know what the others can do.

Round 1: 10 walk slow, die instantly from spray bottle water, 3 have option to flee.

Round 2: 10 can't walk, spread out arms length from each other, die instantly. 3 can't flee and must go through them

Round 3: 10 can walk fast, not run, don't die from spray bottle but 3 don't know that. Take away 2 spray bottles, can flee.

Round 4: Reverse roles, 3 are now zombies, walk slow for a count of 10 then can walk fast. 10 can all flee.

Round 5: All 13 are Zombies but crowd doesn't know, go put sticky notes on arms in the crowd
