

- Characteristics of High-Performance Teams

 - Top performance management drivers of engagement
 - Team members have clearly defined roles and responsibilities
 - Mutual respect among leaders and team members
 - Respect for open and clear communications with two-way feedback
 - Manage work and deadlines based on priorities
