Topic I: Before You Go

10 minutes

- The first steps to success:

 - Military, Vocational Schools, Apprenticeships, Unions, and MORE!
 - Doing what you love does not have to boil down to a degree, there is a lot of different ways to have a career in today's day and age, be open and ready to accept alternatives so you can do what you love!
 - LOCATION LOCATION!
 - There are many pros and cons to understanding the location of a college campus. There are many decisions to make when discussing living in urban, suburban and rural communities that will play a very large part into your academic career
 - Financial Considerations
 - What do your finances look like? Understanding your finances and ability to afford college could play a very large part in where you end up for many different reasons.
 - Factors to consider:
 - Budget, financial aid options, scholarships, tuition costs overall.

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Topic 2: Academics and Campus Life

10 minutes

Academic Programs

- There are many different paths that students may want to take in the future, ranging from business to music to public health to psych. Whatever path this may be, it is important to understand that a school should be a top priority in its academics before everything else.
 - The goal of looking into different academic programs is to learn about how the school can best prepare you for your future and put you in the best positions to learn.

Campus Life

- The classroom and the bedroom are not the only places where students will be during their time as a students, no matter who this may be, all students need to enjoy some recreation at different points.
 - These items to consider are:
 - Clubs
 - Sports
 - Student Centers and Recreations Buildings
 - Fraternity and Sororities
 - Other Items (Concerts, On Campus Events, Etc.)
- Facilities and Misc.
 - In regards to the facilities that a college can offer, there are many that are overlooked that play a large part in the enjoyment that one has at an institution
 - These items to consider are:
 - Dining Halls
 - Mental Health and Physical Health Accommodations
 - Dormitory and On-Campus Living

Topic 3: Visits and Making the Best Choice

10 minutes

- College Visits:
 - Learn about what makes the college the college! A tour and visit are ways for prospective college students to learn from staff and students of different

- universities. Ask questions, find out where you would take your classes, and more!
- This is the first impression you will have on the campus, take all of the culture, environment, and vibe of the college into strong consideration when hoping to attend a college.
- Making the decisions and Final Choice
 - The most important part of the entire college selection process is not where you will fit in best, but instead, what college will be able to fit YOU and set you best up for success.
 - In applications, show your interest in what you see yourself getting out of the college. Once you are accepted the rest is history...
