## Topic 2: Sharing Your Vision

- Go back to Find Your Why? Video
  - Communicate by sharing your why first, then your how, then your what
- KISS
  - Keep It Simple Silly
    - Keep it fun and serious
- Should be clear, simple, short, and easy to understand
- Write it down
  - Do an exercise where everyone takes an index card and writes down their visions
  - Have people share if they're comfortable
  - Be prepared to share your own personal vision

## Topic 3: Incorporating Your Vision into the Team

- Work with the team to determine the team's vision
  - Determined through Mission Statement, Brainstorming Session, or leader's personal vision for the team
- Figure out how improving yourself can help you support your team or how your goal can impact or contribute to the team's vision
