



# Recapturing Your Lodge's History: Gathering and Preserving Lodge History

**Session Length: 45 Minutes** 

Through this session, you will:

**Explain:** What information should be gathered in the preservation of a Lodge history

**Demonstrate:** Show examples of some best practices in the data collection for a history **Guide**: Guidance will include where to find information and begin organization of data **Enable:** As participants leave this session, they will be able to begin to develop or maintain

a local lodge history

## **Learning Outcomes:**

- Methods to collecting oral history information and conducting interviews
- Methods of collecting and organizing written history information
- Compiling pictorial list of memorabilia items

#### **Theme Connection:**

The theme of NOAC 2018 is "Decide Your Destiny," emphasizing the message that today's decisions shape tomorrow's reality. This session will relay this theme in the following ways:

- Recapturing the history of your lodge is a great way to show where you have come from, where your roots are.
- The other sessions in this series "Remembering Our Roots" and "Putting Together a Lodge History" along with this session will assist the Lodge in capturing where it has come from and potentially discover where they may go in the future.

**Session Narrative** 

3 minutes Introduction

- Session is a part of a three-session series.
  - o Remembering our Roots
  - o Gathering and Preserving
  - o Putting it all together

9 minutes **Oral History** 

- Create a list of questions
- Interview members (start with older membership)
- Record interviews (on tape or other media and transcribe to written media)

**Trainer Instructions:** Ask participants to write down some questions they feel would be appropriate to ask during an oral interview.

9 minutes **Written History** 

- What paper documents should be collected (including digital)
- How to order the documents
- Collection of print and digital pictures
- Conservation and preservation methods for paper, photos, and other materials

**Trainer Instructions:** Ask participants to write down some documents they feel would be appropriate to collect and review for a written history.

**Trainer Instructions:** Ask participants to write down some methods that should be employed in the conservation and preservation of any artifacts they may be using.
