



### Scouting's Barriers to Abuse

Two-deep leadership for all OA activities must meet the requirements of Scouting's Barriers to Abuse, found at <a href="https://www.scouting.org/Training/YouthProtection.aspx">www.scouting.org/Training/YouthProtection.aspx</a>. The relevant portion of this policy is quoted below:

Two registered adult leaders 21 years of age or over are required at all Scouting activities, including meetings. There must be a registered female adult leader over 21 in every unit serving females. A registered female adult leader over 21 must be present for any activity involving female youth. Notwithstanding the minimum leader requirements, age and program appropriate supervision must always be provided.

### **Adult Supervision/Coed Activities**

Two registered adult leaders 21 years of age or over are required at all Scouting activities, including meetings and those including parent and child. A registered female adult leader age 21 or over must be present for any activity including female youth. Notwithstanding the minimum leader requirement, age and program appropriate supervision must always be provided.

### **Adult Candidate Nomination Form**

Each year, upon holding a unit election for youth candidates that results in at least one youth candidate being elected, the unit committee may nominate registered unit adults (age 21 or over) to the lodge adult selection committee. The number of adults nominated can be no more than two-thirds of the number of youth candidates elected, rounded up where the number of youth candidates is not a multiple of three. In addition to the two-thirds limit, the unit committee may nominate the currently-serving unit leader (but not assistant leaders), as long as they have served as unit leader for at least the previous 12 months. Recommendations of the lodge adult selection committee, with the approval of the Scout executive, will be candidates for induction, provided all conditions are fulfilled. Consult the <u>Handbook for Officers and Advisers</u> for procedures for district and council Scouters.
